Trainings – Receive free registration to advocacy trainings and capacity building trainings.

As an organizational member, you will receive free registration to advocacy trainings and capacity building trainings. Paid members will be the first to receive invitations to trainings and will be given priority during registration. These trainings will be open to your organization's board, staff, and community members. **CACF advocacy workshops** train participants in policy advocacy. These trainings will increase participants' understanding of New York City policymaking and budget processes and improve advocacy skills and strategies. **CACF capacity building trainings** focus on strengthening leadership development, organizational development, program development, and community engagement. These trainings will enhance the capacity of your organization to better serve Asian Pacific American children and families and build a stronger pan-Asian voice in policymaking.

Collaborative Grants – Participate in grant proposals for collaborative projects led by CACF.

As an organizational member, you will be invited to participate in grant proposals for collaborative projects led by CACF, such as New York State's Patient Navigator Grant and Project CHARGE (Coalition for Health Access to Reach Greater Equity), CACF's 15-member pan-Asian health advocacy collaborative. CACF has coordinated collaborative projects, working with over 30 member agencies to secure nearly \$2 million for the Asian Pacific American community. Funders have included the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services, NYC Administration for Children's Services, W.K. Kellogg Foundation, Asian & Pacific Islander American Health Forum, and Deutsche Bank.

Access to Decisionmakers – Meet with elected and appointed officials and share your needs at advocacy days, meetings, briefings, hearings, and press conferences.

As an organizational member, you will be invited to share your concerns and identify strategies in CACF's advocacy campaigns. CACF fights for improved policies, funding, and services for Asian Pacific American children and families. You will have opportunities to meet with elected and appointed officials and to share your needs at advocacy days, meetings, briefings, hearings, rallies, and press conferences. CACF members will be the first to receive invitations to speaking engagements and advocacy and policy events. CACF helps member agencies prepare for legislative visits, testimonies, and public hearings.
