

Open Letter: Standing in Solidarity in Response to Anti-Asian COVID-19 Related Discrimination

The Coalition for Asian American Children and Families along with the undersigned concerned individuals and organizations supporting the diverse communities across New York City, and dedicated to the well-being of those most marginalized, call on our elected officials, mainstream and ethnic media, and the general public to stand together against xenophobia and protect the health and well-being of all our children and families.

We call for solidarity in support of Asian Pacific Americans, primarily East Asian-presenting Americans, who have been subjected to rampant discrimination and hate surrounding the novel 2019 coronavirus (COVID-19) crisis.

We strongly denounce the racist language against Asians and Asian Pacific Americans employed by United States' President Donald J. Trump and his administration, who cited COVID-19 as the "Chinese virus" and "Kung-flu." This only fuels anti-East Asian sentiments. With the U.S. State Department's push to call the disease the "Wuhan virus" at the G7 summit and the recently proposed House of Representative Resolution 907, our federal government is further cementing the harmful narrative of Asian Pacific Americans as "perpetual foreigners" and failing to protect them from more stigma and discrimination. When such words and actions come from the highest level of our government, racism becomes more normalized.

We know from our nation's history, during times of fear and uncertainty, people of color and immigrants have been scapegoated and targeted through hateful actions, both on individual and systemic levels. Jewish immigrants were blamed for the spread of tuberculosis at the turn of the 20th century. Anti-Black racism and homophobia surrounded the HIV/AIDS epidemic. Asian Pacific Americans have faced racist U.S. policies dating back to the 1882 Chinese Exclusion Act, the 1917 Immigration Act, and the internment of Japanese Americans through executive order in the 1940s.

Today, fear and uncertainty are once again resulting in targeted acts of racism towards Asian Pacific Americans. In New York City, there have been violent attacks against East Asian-presenting individuals, a steep decline in business at Asian-owned enterprises, and

xenophobic representations of the virus in local media. Disease does NOT discriminate based on race or ethnicity. COVID-19 is a public health concern that impacts ALL of us.

We are New Yorkers, residents of a city that is rich in diversity and strong in community.

During this period of heightened anxiety and fear, we must not allow misinformation and prejudice about communities of color to divide us. We must listen to and learn from each others' experiences and tackle all racially motivated discrimination. We call on each of us - individuals, families, communities, organizations, businesses, media, and the local government - to stand together both in the face of, and in the aftermath of this crisis. Only through solidarity will we be able to collectively heal and address the inequities faced by the most marginalized communities.
